Each year during the annual NCDA Global Career Development Conference, NCDA honors those who exemplify excellence in career development. The Eminent Career Award

The Eminent Career Award is awarded to individuals who have influenced either the practice of, or the thinking (theorizing) about career development through leadership activities or scholarship. Their careers are characterized by frequent, periodic, and sustained activities over a substantial period of time. This award is considered NCDA's highest honor. And the award goes to...

Robert Lent, who has made outstanding contributions across career theory, practice, and scholarship. As lead author of the Social-Cognitive Theory of Careers he has offered the field a conceptual model to explain interests and their development. Lent has published 35 book chapters and 111 articles in premiere journals, and coedited 7 books. He has made more than 150 professional presentations and his 1994 monograph on Social-Cognitive Theory of Careers has more than 2,500 citations.

The Outstanding Career Practitioner Award recognizes practicing career counselors, consultants, or teachers for outstanding performance in day-to-day service. Each of the following areas are considered: years of service, quality of service, and participation and leadership in professional associations. And the awards go to...



Heather Maietta, has demonstrated an enthusiasm and creativity for the field of Career Development. She has worked in Career Development for over 15 years, and her work in education and the

development of exemplary career service programs has been well recognized. She is involved in many professional organizations related to providing outstanding career services and works tirelessly to provide those services to her students, her organizations, and her community. Maietta continues her commitment to the field by serving as Editor of the Higher Education Department for NCDA's *Career Developments* Magazine.



Robert Miles, provided a wide variety of career counseling and job search services to a diverse population at Gateway Community College in the career services office for nearly 35 years before recently

retiring as Director Emeritus with several presidential awards. During that time he designed and taught a Career Planning for credit course, provided career counseling and service benefit certifications to over 200 veterans, and taught workshops on veteran's issues to faculty and community groups. He served as the director, counselor and teacher at a Veterans' Upward Bound Program; volunteer counselor at a work-based research unit in a VA Medical Center; and a private practice professional focusing on autistic youth and adults.

The Merit Award

The NCDA Merit Award honors individuals who have made significant contributions to the field of career development including education and mentoring of career counseling students, development of or leadership in exemplary career programs, conducting significant research in the field, and/or advocacy efforts to inform and persuade policy makers about career development. Diana Bailey, is currently an independent consultant, and prior to that worked for the Maryland State Department of Education and later as a board member of the Maryland Career Development

Association where she made excellent contributions to the health of the organization through her leadership on the professional development committee. Later, because of her expertise with special populations, she was asked to create an online course for CEUonestop.com on the career development process for individuals who are incarcerated, which has become very popular and highly rated. Bailey serves on the CareerOneStop Advisory Board where she provides advice to the CareerOneStop Staff. Bailey has been awarded the Outstanding Leadership in Offender Workforce Development award from the DOWD Partnership, as well as the President's Award from the Maryland Career Development Association.



David Duys, has supported career development through his commitment in research, teaching, service, and policy establishment as a school counselor, a college counselor, a mental health

counselor, counselor educator, and counseling supervisor since 1989. Duys has previously been awarded the Outstanding Alumni Award, Collegiate Teaching Award, Excellence in Teaching, and NCACES Outstanding Professional Teaching Award. Duys' research has been focused in career counseling approaches with special populations, exploring training conditions affecting counselor cognitive complexity, and vocational issues. He served on the editorial board for the Journal of Counselor Education and Supervision from 2002 to 2008, and served as the president of the Iowa Association for Counselor Education and Supervision.

The International Practitioner of the Year Award

The NCDA International Practitioner of the Year Award recognizes one member who has made a significant contribution to the advancement of NCDA's mission in their respective country, as selected by the NCDA International Committee. And the award goes to...



Narender Chadha, a renowned Professor of Psychology at University of Delhi, is an acclaimed national and international scholar known for heading various academic departments, authoring more than 22

books and publications of more than 100 research articles in National and International journals of repute. The President of two prestigious organizations, India Career Development Association (ICDA) and Indian Association of Positive Psychology (IAPP), Dr. Chadha is a certified Fellow of Institute of Career Certification International, USA and the Country Director of Asia Pacific Career Development Association. His illustrious career includes various awards and accolades for his contributions to the field of Psychology.

Service to International Students Award

The NCDA Service to International Students Award is intended to recognize college/university career services offices and/or career centers that have made an active commitment to partnering with and supporting the career development of international students. And the award goes to...

PURDUE CCO

Purdue University Center for Career Opportunities (COO) Global Connections Initiative, with

over 9,000 international students enrolled at the university, the demand for career counseling and career services delivery for international students is significant. They have two dedicated international career services consultants leading the staff that competently meets the international students' career needs. This Global Connection Initiative includes the addition of International Peer Career Coaching program, the Mandarin-English Speaking Career Fair, the Bilingual Student Career Fair and Purdue Pathways (legal assistance for H1B visas). The Center has establish strategic partnerships with campus and non-campus stakeholders to provide holistic career services for international students.

Exemplary Career Center Award
